The tumbling E chart tests the visual acuity of young children and others who can't read letters aloud. 20/20 vision is considered "normal" vision, meaning you can read at 20 feet a letter that most human beings should be able to read at 20 feet.

Hold the printed chart 14 inches from your face. Go ahead and wear corrective contacts if you have them, but no glasses -- that ' s cheating! Start reading at the top line and work your way down. The first line that appears blurry will have your ideal magnification listed to the left.

Tape this page at eye level where light is consistent and without glare. Put on your reading glasses and cover one eye. Fix your gaze on the center black dot. Keeping your gaze fixed, try to see if any lines are distorted or missing. Mark the defect on the chart. TEST EACH EYE SEPARATELY.

This became the standard vision measurement. Also, Snellen developed the idea of a 5 x 5 grid for a standard for his optotypes. Each optotype must meet certain percentage requirements in this grid before it is used for testing. This helps to make a uniform and equal vision chart. The Snellen eye chart is the basis for many other vision tests.
